On Tuesday 9 June 2020, the Secretary of State for Education clarified the position on the full opening of primary schools for a month before the end of term. It is now clear that schools cannot welcome back all students in the current COVID-19 situation. The expectation now is that where possible, more children will return to schools where there is capacity in the school to accommodate them with full social distancing measures in place.
