## Sandwell Council offers back to school advice and support

With children due back to school in a few weeks, Sandwell Council has a set up a dedicated website for parents and young people.

Schools are working hard and planning for the return of all pupils for the autumn term and are making sure they are ready to welcome children back in September.

Councillor Joyce Underhill, cabinet member for best start in life, said: "Most children and young people will have been away from school for six months, so it is important parents and children get ready to return this September.

Our team has done a wonderful job in supporting schools throughout this difficult time. We will continue to offer support to schools as they plan to fully reopen.

It is important parents and carers talk to the children and young people to prepare them for school."

Deputy leader, Councillor Maria Crompton, added: "I have no doubt, the majority of children can't wait to get back to learning in the classroom and to see their friends but there will be some who feel anxious about this.

Before I go, our colleagues at Adoption@Heart have been in touch and have asked us to share the below information with you all:





Adoption@Heart is following Government guidance and quickly adapting the way they provide services to ensure that those interested in becoming adoptive parents are still able to proceed, and that support services can continue.

The adoption agency has seen a significant rise in the number of enquiries from people wanting to find out more about adopting a child during the coronavirus pandemic.

Since lockdown began in March, more than 200 people have come forward to express their interest in adoption – and the enquiries keep coming in every day.

The Regional Adoption Agency for the Black Country – which provides adoption services for Wolverhampton, Dudley and Walsall Council as well as Sandwell Children's Trust, is keen to raise awareness of adoption and find homes for children currently waiting to be adopted.

Anyone can adopt, whether they are single, living together, married, a same sex couple, in employment or not working, or already have children or not. Potential adopters must legally be a UK resident and have been so for at least 12 months, as well as being aged 21 or over.

They should ideally have a spare bedroom and be able to provide a stable home for a child until adulthood and beyond.

Virtual information events are held every two weeks and are the perfect opportunity for prospective adopters to find out more and have your questions answered.
