Changes in the Children in Care Teams

We are currently in the process of redesigning our Children and Care and Care Leavers Teams.

Our aim is to offer an area of focus, specialism and expertise to our young people. We aim to focus on permanency and good quality life work for our younger children and for the over 14's there will be a focus of good quality Pathway Plans, understanding the risks associated with adolescence and preparing for transition to adulthood. In addition to this there will be a continued focus on good health, education, family time and building lifelong links.

There will be 3 under 14 teams and 2 over 14 teams. We have identified the 5 team managers for each team:

Team 1 (Under 14's): Paula Jarrett Team 2 (Under 14's): Marie Shepperd Team 3 (Under 14's): Laura Martin Team 4 (Over 14's): Rochelle Blake Team 5 (Over 14's): Lorraine Salmon.

All of our Team Managers are permanent members of staff. Each team will have 7 Social Workers and at least 1 Social Care Assistant (full-time equivalent). We are in the process of working through expressions of interests from our staff to identify who will be in each team.

Over the next 4 weeks, Social Workers will inform their young people and carers if there will be any changes. Social workers will continue to work with the children in their area. There will be a change for some young people but staff are not leaving therefore young people and carers will still be able to approach their previous workers to clarify any questions.

For our Care Leavers we will be creating an additional team. This will mean there are 2 dedicated Care Leavers Teams, with 2 permanent Team Managers:

Care Leavers, Team 1: Claire Tate

Care Leavers, Team 2: Rebecca Greenhouse

The 2 Service Managers in Children in Care and Care Leavers will remain the same, they will be responsible for the following areas:

Stuart Lance-Pencheon: Team 1, 2 and 3 (Under 14's), the Contact Centre and the Life Story Project.



Michelle O'Farrell: Team 4 and 5 (Over 14's) and Care Leavers, Team 1 and 2.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact your Supervising Social Worker or the allocated worker.



As always, your Supervising Social Worker is there to provide any help, support and advice that you may need. Please take care, stay safe and we'll speak to you all again next month.
