Self-isolation saves lives

Covid-19 remains a serious health risk and self-isolation can save lives.

It is important that everyone protects themselves and others by self-isolating immediately:

- if you register a positive test result
- if you have Covid-19 symptoms
- if someone in your household has Covid-19 and you are not fully vaccinated and over the age of 18 years and six months
- if you have been told to self-isolate by Test and Trace following contact with someone who tested positive.

Individuals do not have to self-isolate as a contact of someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 if they are under 18 and 6 months or if they are fully vaccinated. When to self-isolate guidance can be found on the Government website.

If you are a contact of a positive case, you do need to get a PCR test

The six-week campaign, now in its 12th year, has a special online focus this year, with activities also being planned across Sandwell's six towns including speed awareness, walkabouts, litter picks and skip days. We will also be launching the resident consultation for Sandwell's new Community Safety strategy.

The campaign is led by Sandwell Council for the Safer Sandwell Partnership, which brings together the council, Sandwell Police, West Midlands Fire Service and many other partner organisations.
