You must self-isolate if you:

- have any Covid-19 symptoms
- have tested positive for Covid-19
- are 18+, alerted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive Covid-19 case and have NOT been

double vaccinated at least 14 days.

It's a legal requirement to self-isolate if you are told to by NHS Test and Trace. Got symptoms? <u>Get tested</u>.

IMPORTANT BINS UPDATE



Update on bin collections

Today (Friday 22 October) and Tuesday 26 October there will be further changes to bin collections due to the continued strike action being undertaken by some employees at Serco, our waste collection provider.

The focus of Sandwell Council will be to ensure that the disruption caused to bin collections is kept to a minimum.

The council has agreed to suspend garden waste collections today (Friday) and Tuesday 26 October to allow the remaining crews to concentrate on the collection of domestic waste and recycling bin collections.

These garden waste collections will now take place on Friday 5 November and Tuesday 9 November.

On the days of the strike the bin crews will prioritise domestic waste bin collections. Recycling bin collections will take place, however there may be some delays to these collections.

Residents who do not receive a collection on their usual day, should leave grey bins and recycling bins out until they have been emptied. This will be done as soon as possible.

Those residents affected by the suspension of garden waste collections who are unable to wait until their next collection day may wish to take their garden waste to the tip. Bookings for the tip can be made by visiting the council website.

There are additional crews working this week and over the weekend to catch up on bin collections that have been missed today (Friday), and additional crews are planned for next week to reduce the delays.

The council works closely with the voluntary sector and the West Midlands Lieutenancy to offer help to any organisations that would like support through the application process. This includes special QAVS workshops.






ℍTalk to us about safety






West Bromwich Quarter Project - what are your ideas?
