Sandwell Connexions recognises that it's a difficult time for many Sandwell young people who are in care/former care and are anxious about their career opportunities.

Connexions are operating a full 'Careers' service for your young person aged between 12 and 18.

- The free service includes:
- Impartial careers information, advice and guidance virtual interviews
- Help with reviewing and updating their CV's
- Job search and interview techniques
- Help with changing career path and identifying skills and strengths
- Liaison with colleges and training providers who are offering online training/apprenticeships
- Exploring virtual work experience within Sandwell Council

• The annual New Year New Start careers show which offers a wealth of advice, information on Post 16 Education and employment opportunities from a wide range of Colleges/training providers is aimed at 14 – 19-year olds and carers/parents

Fostering Forum January 2022

This month we had updates from the support teams as well as the recruitment team.

Andrew Kapaso spoke about a new support offer that has been introduced to support connected and mainstream carers who are considering Special Guardianship Orders. We are currently in the process of recruiting a support worker to assist with the new project.

Our new 'Fostering Friendly Employer' Policy is ready to be signed off by senior managers and will support Trust employees with their fostering role.

Our guest speaker – Claire Martin, Adolescent Service Manager, provided us with an informative presentation on the role of the family support team and the family group conference service

We discussed internet safety and social media in the foster home and are looking at how we can support carers manage devices that are accessed by the children they look after.



What is LGBT+ History Month?




